

IMPORTANT UPDATES – PLEASE READ!!

January 2019

*Effective November 20, 2014 IDPH requires all food service workers to obtain Illinois approved, ANSI accredited food safety certification known as Certified Food Handler (CFH) training. Certified Food Protection Managers (CFPM) are NOT required to obtain the CFH certification.

*Effective January 1, 2018 IDPH requires **ALL** CFPM in high priority establishments to obtain the Illinois Allergen Awareness training. One CFPM/Allergen trained person shall be on duty at all times in high priority establishments. Excludes: grocery stores, convenience stores, daycares, schools, assisted living or long term care facilities, certified food handlers, and certified food protection managers for risk category 2 or 3 establishments. (See Illinois Food Code, for risk category definitions)
