

Monroe County Food Truck Requirements

Current permit with Monroe County, or from the County that the truck considers its “Home County”.

Current Certified Food Protection Manager License for at least one person on the truck at all times that food is being prepared and served. All other employees must have Illinois Food Handler License.

Three compartment sink and at minimum one hand sink.

Hot and cold running water.

Wastewater storage.

Smooth and easily cleanable floors, walls, and ceilings (i.e. Stainless Steel or FRP).

Sufficient equipment to prepare food, and to make sure food temperatures are maintained below 41° for cold foods and above 135° for hot foods.

A generator or other power source for the truck must be provided, do not assume that there will be an electrical hook-up.

Receptacles for garbage in the truck, and for customers outside the truck.

A written copy of agreement between the Food Truck owner and the facility used as its commissary.

If the Food Truck is permitted in a County other than Monroe County a copy of the most recent inspection of the Food Truck as well as its commissary must be provided.

Any requirements for Electrical, Ventilation, and other plumbing should be referred to your local fire department.
